Ben Langham is a law enforcement training leader and instructional designer with nearly 24 years of service, focused on improving officer decision-making, leadership, and readiness during critical incidents. He currently serves as a Lieutenant with the Kenai Police Department, where he has overseen all department training since 2017, including curriculum development, instructor mentoring, compliance management, and annual in-service planning. Throughout his career, he has designed and led multi-day, multi-disciplinary training exercises involving federal, state, and local partners, with a strong emphasis on incident command, coordination, and leadership accountability.

Ben is the co-founder of BlueLogic Training, a scenario-based training platform built for public safety professionals. He has led the development of more than 200 interactive training courses focused on critical incident response, leadership under stress, and real-world problem solving. His work emphasizes adult learning principles, written decision articulation, after-action analysis, and instructor-led coaching. BlueLogic courses are used by agencies across the country.

Ben holds a Master's degree in Administration of Justice from the University of Alaska Fairbanks and a Graduate Certificate from the University of Virginia. He is a graduate of the FBI National Academy (Session 268) and has completed formal Methods of Instruction and Field Training Instructor certifications. He has taught at the FBI Command College, the Senior Law Enforcement Executive Association (SRLEEA) Conference, and statewide Michigan Elections Law Enforcement training.
