

Dr. Kimberly B. Stewart - Biography

Dr. Kimberly Stewart serves as the Curriculum Administrator for New Hampshire Police Standards and Training (PST), where she has been a member of the team since June 2022. In this role, she oversees the curriculum for the Full-time, Part-time, and Corrections academies, as well as the Court Security Officer program. She is responsible for reviewing all lesson plans and course content to ensure alignment between learning outcomes, assessments, and objectives. Additionally, she developed and delivers the quarterly Instructor Development course for certified law enforcement officers across the state.

Previously, Dr. Stewart spent 12 years in the field of criminal justice as an attorney, professor, and academic administrator. She directed the Criminal Justice programs at Regis College, Mount Ida College, and Mount Washington College. During her tenure in higher education, she was instrumental in developing curriculum for both online and classroom environments, including courses in Criminal Law, Criminal Procedure, Courts, Corrections, and Juvenile Justice.

A licensed attorney, Dr. Stewart also served as a court-appointed public defender in Massachusetts, where she provided legal representation to indigent persons in criminal cases. Her legal expertise includes legal research, reasoning, and analysis, which she has also taught to first-year law students.

Dr. Stewart holds a PhD in Criminal Justice from Nova Southeastern University and a Juris Doctor from the Massachusetts School of Law, where she graduated Cum Laude. She also holds a Master of Public Administration from the University of Baltimore and a Master of Science in Criminal Justice from Kaplan University. Her professional credentials include certification in Effective Teaching Practices from the Association of College and University Educators (ACUE) and training in the Quality Matters (QM) rubric and instructional design.
