Dr. F. Wayne Laney, Jr., PCI®, began his career in 1993 at the University of South Carolina and is currently a dedicated educator who joined Rowan-Cabarrus Community College as a full-time Criminal Justice faculty member in August 2015, following one year of service as an adjunct instructor. He currently serves as Program Chair for the Criminal Justice and 911 Communication and Operations Programs.

In addition to teaching Criminal Justice, Dr. Laney is an instructor in Emergency Management, the Work-Based Learning Faculty Coordinator for the Criminal Justice and 911 programs, the Criminal Justice Association Faculty Advisor, and a North Carolina Law Enforcement General Instructor teaching in both Basic Law Enforcement Training (BLET) and General Instructor School.
