James C. Molloy is a public safety professional with extensive experience in many facets of his profession. He is a recognized instructor and public speaker, presenting at the TCOLE annual training conference, Texas School Safety Conference and at IADLEST. JC is a recognized expert in the areas of training, policy development, use of force, and active threat response as well as an IADLEST National Certified Instructor.

JC has served as a Firefighter/EMT with the El Paso Fire Department, a Public Safety Lieutenant with the Dallas/Fort Worth Airport Department of Public Safety, a Traffic/Accident Investigation Officer and Tactical Team Operator with the Arlington Texas Police Department, and a Sergeant with the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission.

As the Commander of DFW's Hazardous Incident Response team, he developed training and policy for hazardous materials and rescue operations. He also served for 10 years as a guest instructor for TEEEX in annual Aircraft Fire Rescue and Hazardous Materials schools. He has developed training curriculum for school-based response to active threat incidents as well as developed policies and procedures for the state-wide implementation of this program.
